The Student Government is a student organisation of a special nature and competence at a university. All students of the given university are members of the Student Government. In Poland, the Student Government acts based on the Higher Education Act of the 27th July 2005 (Journal of Laws of 2005 No. 164, item 1365, as amended).

Pursuant to the Higher Education Act of the 27th July 2005, the tasks of the Student Government of PWSFTViT include, among others:

- Representing all students of the School,
- Supporting and initiating the School's activities related to students' cultural and living issues,
- Dividing the financial resources allotted by the School's authorities for student issues,
- Giving opinion about curricula and schedules, and agreeing with the School's Senate on the changes in the rules and regulations of studies,
- Agreeing with the vice-chancellor on the rules of determining the amount, granting procedures and the payment of student benefits to students,
- Approving the candidacy for the office of the Deputy Vice Chancellor in charge of Student Affairs,
- Preparing and promoting the Student Code of Ethics,
- Electing members of the School's senate, electoral college, disciplinary commissions and other commissions set up on behalf of the School,
- Putting forward motions to refer disciplinary cases to peer arbitration board,
- Forming the peer arbitration board and determining its organisation and proceedings,
- Organising protest campaigns against collective dispute subjects, concerning significant issues or interests of students,
- Organising student strikes, in case negotiations with the School and other than a strike forms
 of protest have not led to the resolution of the conflict,
- Checking whether the School observes the rules saying that the tuition fee cannot exceed the costs necessary to start and run studies.
